President's Remarks

Of Aspirations and Commitments.....

Even after seven decades of independence we could not change the very structure of our education system. Only expert committees after committees were formed and recommendations have been made but nothing changed our structure of education. Every new government thinks of doing experiments in education most of the time damaging the existing system without much value addition in it. Leadership of Higher Education is dictated from the top and not emerging from among. Originality can not be copied, why to bring commonality across universities, where is the concept of uniqueness? Dissent is the essence of education, but the dissent is being suppressed by the authorities. Teachers' voices have been crashed now a day. Even syllabi is being imposed from the top

Teachers' accountability is on long-term well-being of the society rather than day today accountability. A professor may not have any answer to the question what life should one lead? He has an answer to the question how/what type of life should one lead. Stakeholders' participation in policy making in higher education is totally ignored now a days. Due to Market or Commercial approach towards education, where students are considered as consumers, education is a commodity, everything is evaluated on the basis of cost and benefit. The wonderful Public Private Participation (PPP) model is gradually being replaced by Public versus Private (P v/s P) model. Thousands of schools have been closed/merged with private agencies for lack of students due to lack of facilities and faculties.

Today everybody talks about world class institutions of Higher education. Quality is the life line of any higher education system. But the biggest challenge today in the way of achieving quality in Higher education is the inability of the system to attract young talented, meritorious students to teaching and research. The deteriorating service conditions of teaching faculty and growing casual approach to the teaching profession in the country is discouraging many of the young talents to come to this noble profession. Another challenge before quality in Higher

education is increasing bureaucratization of the higher education system. To address the problem of shortage of quality teachers in the higher education sector in the country, government should act decisively. Hope the proposed New Education Policy will address these issues. Nearly one and half years after it became due the 7th UGC Pay Commission Report is not released. Government wants bring drastic changes even without taking into confidence the stake-holders by creating HEERA. Is there any need for such a hurry to scrap UGC or AICTE?

Everywhere UGC drawing teachers are under scrutiny. But the tragedy is that scrutiny/verification of accountability by those incompetent/unqualified in-charge administrators, who never bothered about such things when they were in teaching position. Are they not accountable for delay in our regular salary, placements and arrears? Academic bureaucrats are much more dangerous than our bureaucrats. A day is not far off when teachers demand for non academicians to be their administrators if this continues.

At the state level we are happy that we could get major portion of our much delayed UGC arrears. Thanks to the efforts of FUCTAK. But there are many unresolved issues like pending placements, appointment of Principals, filling of vacancies, Ph. D increment etc. Even our regional offices are without full time Joint Directors. Uniform academic calendar, Uniform dress code, uniform college timings are the issues being created without much practical thought. We need to oppose such decisions which do more harm than good to the students and teachers.

During this term we could achieve; timely meetings, regular contacts with members, use of information technology, contact and interaction with state and national leaders, department officials, time-to-time suggestions and interaction with University officials about academic matters, release of UGC and other arrears etc. Still there are issues to be resolved.

This AGM is intended to create a forum to raise the issue when our central leadership raises the issues with the state Higher Education Minister and representative. Let us begin our fight to demand for the release of 7th UGC Pay scales from this forum.

I always believe in “working together works” It is the senior AMUCT leaders, past and present office bearers and our esteemed members who made us to work. Without their endless cooperation, support and encouragement we would not have been able to travel this distance.

Editorial

The tremendous increase in the number of universities and colleges ever since India became politically free from the British rule is a reflection of the incredible growth of higher education. The quantitative growth in view of the big young population has been seen as a marker of India's focussed strategy of the MHRD for the national development. With all the discussions, educational summits, academic meets and the great acclaim for the long strides taken by the higher education, the fundamental question whether the higher education today caters to the actual requirements of the young entrants of higher education remains unanswered. Probably when we observe closely we become aware of some of the hard and painful realities in the process of dissemination of knowledge.

Let us for a while think about the trend of higher education in Karnataka. Higher Education in Karnataka today, in spite of many lacunae is certainly sought after by many enthusiastic youngsters from within and outside the state. The enrolment to degree courses is on the rise these days on account of the fixed minimum eligibility for many careers. It is in this context the higher education institutions are supposed to focus more on imparting professional skills along with the academic and research training. In the state of Karnataka today, there are about 48 universities (central university-1, private universities-8, deemed universities- 14, and state universities-25- includes general, technical, medicine, music, law, folklore, women's, veterinary, agriculture, horticulture, cultural universities); 6 Institutions of National Importance; around 1551 colleges(includes Government colleges-315, Aided colleges-412, Unaided colleges- 824). The statistics given above is a clear indication of the weight and importance given to higher education in the state. It is indeed a very big number compared to the number of institutions existed ten years ago. The prominent game players and significant regulators of higher education are the central and state governments. The University Grants Commission of MHRD and Department of Collegiate Education of the Ministry of Higher Education of the state of Karnataka have been playing a level game and for good or bad they have taken higher education to a stage where quite big number of institutions function as centres of higher learning.

The most basic question about any developing society is about the participation of largest number of strong and young population in production of materialistic comforts and luxuries or knowledge generation. Does the present higher education ensure a great workforce for the production of the things required for the growth of the country? The prerequisites of the workforce are professional skills, innovative mind, healthy interactive soft skills, and a strong morally integrated value. The modern technologically advanced society demands some fundamental knowledge from the people who are going to be the personnels in either companies or civil service. The graduates or post graduates will have to work in the globalised offices and function as not only ambassadors but also as service providers to the people across the globe. It is this situation that should govern the higher educational institutions in their delivery of knowledge and training of the young graduates. Surprisingly at all academic meets, instead of the discussion of this fundamental aspect of higher learning, the focus is on things which do not benefit any of the stakeholders except of course the administrators. The graduates, mostly majority of them become unemployable, and when they are employable they are jobless. Skill training component is almost missing in the syllabi of most of the centres of learning.

Although there are guidelines to make the syllabi inclusive of the employability skill component, the present syllabus of most of the institutions lack this component. Most important of all is that who should own the responsibility of providing jobs to the big graduate population? The teachers say that they are giving training and about the jobs they got nothing to do, the managements say that they provide teaching faculty, the required infrastructure and the jobs the companies or the government should provide, the regulatory bodies say that they give guidelines to institutions to make the graduates employable and the jobs the companies and the corporates should give, the political representatives say that they do their best by establishing new institutions and the jobs that are available graduates should be able to get. Ultimately no stakeholder is accountable as far as jobs are concerned. The partial view of the education process is seen by these stakeholders and it is because of the lack of complete and holistic idea of education. The system consequently has ended up with a pathetically sick system of higher education. There is an unbelievable mismatch between the number graduates coming out of institutions and the jobs that are available, there is an absolute imbalance between the increased number of colleges and the enrolment, there is a big gap between the infrastructure available and the number of enrolment, there is an unjustifiable wide chasm between the competent training force and the huge number of students, there is a wide gulf between the institutions run by the Government and the private managements. Now the big question is who has to match the differences, reduce the gaps, and play the level game of balancing the whole system to make it more useful and relevant.

Why Indian universities and colleges score dismally low in global rankings? Experts attribute several reasons for such poor showing, from lack of competent teachers to shortage of funds. The shortcomings of the Indian higher education system are not merely infrastructural but attitudinal as well, said Yugank Goyal, Associate Professor of Economics at O.P. Jindal Global University. He said he had found Indian students reluctant to be academicians "because the job of teaching is not financially rewarding (and) the most talented pool of individuals get scared away from this profession". "As a result, we have to create an army of ad-hoc teachers in colleges. We are not sincere about education in India." The comment seems to be apt to our education system. The ad hoc arrangements will not take anywhere our sick system.

This kind of paralysed system has given birth to organizations such as AIFUCTO, FUCTAK, AMUCT. AMUCT's thirty one years' journey has been quite fulfilling and rightly directed for the good of the system in higher education. Initially the organisation had two locations for its educational trajectories- Udupi and Mangaluru. Unity is Strength was a guiding principle for the founding leaders of the teachers' movement. It is this unalterable spirit that took everybody all along the movement to form AMUCT, an exclusive teachers' organization. The organisation aimed at discussing how to rectify the crucial issues that prevented the development of the education system. The regular meetings to discuss issues, the sustained follow ups to appeal the authorities about the need for educational reforms, the well planned agitations to correct the problems and the mistakes, the social concerns and associations with other organizations have been always in the interest of improving the system. The AMUCT besides its vision to protect and motivate the teaching fraternity has been canvassing for educational reforms. The short sighted educational strategies of the governments resulted in total mess of affairs where nothing is clear about who is controlling whom and why. The autonomy initiative of the UGC seems to be at threat when the present State Ministry of Higher Education proposed to establish Higher Education Recruitment Commission and Higher Education Construction Company as it envisions the direct political entry in to the campuses of universities.

NAAC accreditations should work as catalysts in the growth of the institutions. The CGPA of the institutions and the peer team reports indicate the institutional performances and their road map. The new initiative of the MHRD to rank institutions through NIRF is yet another significant indicator. However, the institutions seem to be losing their grounds of dynamic role in producing top class graduates. The dismal performance at higher educational institutions cannot continue as there is dire need to upgrade, strengthen and up-lift current system to be more beneficial and contribute effectively by partaking in the developmental projects of the nation.

The sensibility required for listening to all the issues and correcting them is more of attitudinal and therefore the stakeholders should discuss how they are going to rectify this situation. AMUCT is a platform to appeal to the authority repeatedly about the need for educational reforms in India. All the stakeholders should come together to bring reforms and improve the system. The frontline leaders should allow various organisations and the people involved to discuss the issues widely and come up with an action plan for the future, instead of framing guidelines that have no actual meaning when the reality is entirely different. For instance, the schemes to strengthen the research output of the faculty do not reach the target groups appropriately as it has to pass through the bureaucratic hands. And when it reaches the researchers, the specified time slot given either gets over or during the entire exercise the faculty due to anxiety and mental pressure may lose interest in research once for all. Faculty Improvement Programme or Faculty Development Programme is seen as free time and the faculty gets all sorts of works by the employers. The academic output is measured only through the results rather than the research projects undertaken by the institutions.

The proposed Higher Education Empowerment Regulation Agency (HEERA) is expected to take the place of the existing UGC and if it is just a Grants Distribution Agency it will be old wine in the new bottle. The teachers' organisations across India do offer great assistance at every stage to the frontline leaders and especially the AMUCT has been lauded for its dynamic role in making the system vibrant and useful.

The editorial committee records all the achievements of AMUCT during 2016-17 under the leadership of Dr. Ummappa Poojary, President, Dr. Kumara Hegde B. A. General Secretary, and all other office bearers.

Minutes of the Second MCM of AMUCT

For the year 2016-17

Held on 28-1-2017, at 2.30 pm

at AMUCT Office, Mangaluru

- The president Dr. Ummappa Poojary called the meeting to order. The president also welcomed the members and read out the agenda of the meeting.
- Dr. Kumara Hegde B. A., General Secretary read out the minutes of the first MCM held on 3rd September 2016. – Agenda was approved.
- In the absence of Smt.. Dejjamma, treasurer, the Vice President Prof. Charles Pais presented the details of expenses incurred from August 2016 to December 2016. – Agenda approved.
- President briefed about the house on recent developments. He presented a consolidated report of AIFUCTO conference held at Guwahati in the second week of December 2016. The serious deliberations of academic conference, paper presentation by Dr. Norbert Lobo, Participation of three lady members of AMUCT were the highlights.

President reported that at the national level nothing much has happened, PRC has not given its final report and agitation programme will be there in coming days.

President reported the house regarding the outcome of the state level meeting of the office bearers of FUCTAK held at Bangalore on 20-1-2017. The meeting was attended by the principal secretary higher education and commissioner, Director, Additional Director of collegiate Education. The important observations of the meeting are

a) Regular payment of salary :

Officers agreed to pay salary well in time and necessary steps will be taken with this regard.

b) Payment of UGC arrears :

Out of around Rs. 330/- crores of UGC arrears due Government has released Rs. 191 crores and it will be disbursed shortly, officers promised to pay the rest of about Rs. 140 crores due within March end so as to clear all the dues completely.

FUCTAK has urged to pay total arrears of teacher appointed on or after 2006 of about Rs. 70 crores with the State Government resources only for which no reimbursement from Central Government as early as possible.

c) Implementation of recommendation contained in Government UGC pay scale order dated : 24-12-2009 :

I. Proper sanctioning of Ph.D/M.Phil advance increments.

FUCTAK strongly urged to pay 2/3 advance increments for in –service/entry teachers as per UGC norms at the rate of 3% per increment and to add to the basic pay.

The clarification letter with regard to this from UGC is given to the officers, for which they have agreed to pass on order correcting all anomalies and to act according to UGC norms.

II. Placement as Professor :

FUCTAK urged to fill up Professor posts, but officers put the technical problem of UGC order saying fill up 75% by CAS and 25% by direct recruitment for which they need sanction of posts, C & R rules amendment. We urged at least fill 75% post by CAS is first phase.

III. Stepping up of pay for seniors

Officers in Principle agreed to pass an order regarding this.

IV. Approval of Principal posts

Officers assured that C&R rule are about to amending to follow the UGC norms with this regard. We demanded fully to follow the UGC norms, for which they have accepted.

V. Providing previous service consideration for placement of stop gap teachers

Principal Secretary denied this benefit, as it was rejected by the Government.

VI. Fill up of vacant posts

Officers told that there is economy measure for fill up of non-teaching posts in Aided colleges. But there is provision for fill up of teaching posts in Aided colleges provided the posts are sanctioned and there is Grant-in-Aid work load.

VII. Providing Grant-in-Aid to colleges started after 01-07-1987 and before 31-03-1995

Officers accepted the demand and said already SC/ST Management colleges got the Grant-in-Aid. Providing Grant-in-Aid to General Management colleges is going on and is under serious consideration.

VIII. Urge to count partially Aided work load and compulsory subjects work load

Rejected the demand as it involves many problems, for which Government do not give the green signal.

IX. Nomination of in-service teachers in the academic bodies of Universities

Secretary accept our demand and asked us for giving proper request and proposal in writing.

X. Compassionate appointment facility for staff families

Officers said that the facility to be extended to collegiate department just like in other departments. Recommendations have passed to the government, shortly the problems will be solved.

XI. Providing 8 stagnation increment to the Aided college employees as in Government servant cases

Secretary in Principle agreed to pass an order to provide the extension of the facility to the Aided employees.]

Agenda approved.

- President informed the house to submit the pending problems related to salary disbursement, placement, arrears etc. with proper documents to the AMUCT office, to enable the office bearers to forward the same to the JD office for the proper action Agenda approved.

- Regarding the proposed choice based curriculum for UG courses.

Dr. Norbert Lobo and Dr. P.N Udaychandra participated in the discussion and highlighted the salient features of CBSS. It is resolved to oppose the introduction of CBSS similar to that which is introduced in PG courses.

Resolved to meet the hon'ble Vice chancellor and to request his office to constitute a larger committee involving AMUCT and UG teachers to the discussion related to the introduction of CBSS at UG level. It is also decided to organize a one day workshop on CBSS by AMUCT involving the experts and university officials.

Agenda approved.

- Regarding University – examination related issues.

 - 2) Resolved to request the university to follow a Common Academic Calendar for Affiliated Colleges and Autonomous Colleges under Mangalore university jurisdiction and restore the reopening to June 15 to odd semester and November 20 to even semester.

Explanation: Students of Autonomous Colleges have been deprived of the opportunities to take part in sports and extracurricular activities. Moreover, the Department of Collegiate Education recognises only the academic calendar of University and not the calendar of Autonomous Colleges.

- 3) Resolved to request university to introduce common ranking list for the affiliated colleges as well as autonomous colleges.

Explanation: At present only the rank list of University is recognised for scholarship to pursue P.G studies and the students of Autonomous Colleges are deprived of this opportunity.

Suggestion: University may conduct a separate examination for the rank students of both University and Autonomous students and declare a common rank list as it is practiced in many universities in Tamilnadu

- 4) Resolved to request university to liberalise its statutes related to Autonomous status to the colleges so that more and more colleges would apply for the same in the future.

11. The President Dr Norbert Lobo, informed to the house about the recent developments and urged the members not to issue statements in the name of AMUCT. It was resolved that

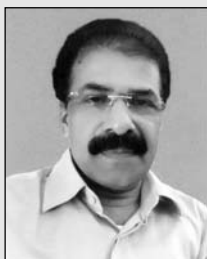

MEMORANDUM

Esteemed Chairman and Members of the PRC,

The Association of Mangalore University College Teachers ®, AMUCT is a registered organisation of college teachers under Mangalore University. It is affiliated to the Federation of University and College Teachers Associations in Karnataka (FUCTAK) at the state level and to the All India Federation of University and College Teachers Organisations (AIFUCTO) at the national level. We fully endorse the submissions made by the AIFUCTO before the Hon'ble Commission.

Mangalore University covering the three districts of Karnataka state, Dakshina Kannada, Udupi and Kodagu, is known for standard higher education institutions. Teachers have played a greater role in providing quality education. Teachers' organisations like AMUCT played a very constructive role in making higher education relevant and qualitative. We strongly believe that higher education alone will lead to progress and quality and excellence are to be integrated with equity and access. We can translate the goal of an inclusive society by focusing on these basic factors in higher education.

Submission before the UGC 7th Pay Review Committee:

We concur with the memorandum submitted by the AIFUCTO. Our submission either supplements or compliments the views expressed by AIFUCTO.

1. **Pay Scales:** Pay scales are to be determined with a vision and mission. We feel the following factors should form the basis of pay scales.
 - Retaining and attracting the best talents towards teaching profession.
 - The late entry into the profession due to post graduate and other relevant qualifications.
 - The priority to be given for developing a qualitative higher education system.
 - The pay package offered in the corporate sector and other private sectors.
 - Relative Pay scales offered in the earlier schemes.

- Relative Pay scales offered in the 7th Central Pay Commission.
- The Principle of 'Equal Pay for Equal work'.
- Maintaining minimum standard of living in tune with increasing cost of living.

Minimum pay scales to be recommended may be:

*Above suggestions are based on the changes between 1996 and 2006 scales. Since Professors will get less than Associate professors, proper corrections may be made.

- 2. Qualification:** A minimum of 55% marks in the concerned post graduate examination or equivalent degree and a pass in NET/SLET or equivalent examination. PhD holders may be exempted from passing NET/SLET examination. For the post of Principal PhD should be minimum qualification with specified years of service. Seniority may be given preference in the selection process.
- 3. Date of implementation:** Pay scales and other benefits are to be implemented uniformly in all the states from **1.1.2016**.
- 4. Placements:** A minimum of 4 placements with the proposed designations should be offered. Career Advancement Scheme for the Associate Professors to move into the post of Professor subject to the same conditions that are applicable to the Post of Professor through CAS in the Universities should be made available.

Explanation: In spite of the recommendations of the 6th pay scales, no efforts have been made to create Professors Post in the colleges. The implementation of the recommendation of the 6th pay commission in this regard has many legal and technical difficulties.

5. **Work Load:** The general work load pattern recommended by earlier pay review committees is acceptable. But stipulating uniform work load for all cadres of teachers is unscientific. A relaxation of a minimum of 2 hours/week teaching should be provided from the level of Associate professor and similar relaxation should be extended to the teachers engaged in guiding Ph D candidates and such other serious research work.

6. **Filling of vacancies:** Goal of UGC scales of Pay, in general and 6th pay scales in particular, is to attract young Talents into Teaching Profession:

Explanation: The most important objective of extending UGC pay scales to colleges and universities has been defeated due to the lack of recruitment into approved vacancies and failure to create new vacancies. Across the country almost in all institutions and universities including aided colleges more than 70 % of the teaching workload is shared by guest / contract faculty with very meagre amount of salary.

Suggestion (i) Committee should come out with concrete and mandatory recommendations along with the new pay scales to make recruitment an ongoing policy. The 7th UGC pay commission may allocate a definite amount to meet this requirement.

(ii) Constituting an All India College Teachers Recruitment Board for Central Universities and National Level Institutes and State level Colleges Teachers Recruitment Board for State universities and Government and Aided Colleges is needed.

7. **Unaided Teachers:** A large number of teachers are working as unaided teachers. There are more than 1500 unaided colleges in Karnataka. Even in Aided colleges, nearly **70% of vacancies** are considered as unaided. Most of these teachers are exploited with abysmally lower salaries and working conditions. Pay scales must be made applicable to such teachers also. The situation is not different in other states too. Unaided teachers and teachers drawing state scales of pay should have an access into Refresher/orientation courses. They should be considered for FIP programmes also. UGC should make it mandatory to the Higher Education Institutions to prescribe minimum qualifications and minimum amount of pay even in the case of appointment of Guest/Contract /Temporary faculty.

8. **Appointment of Principals in the colleges:** The existing provisions for appointment of Principals in the Colleges have many practical problems in its implementation. Consequently many states including Karnataka, even today has not appointed Principal's in any colleges. Around 90% of the colleges are operating without regular (only in-charge) Principals who do not hold any authority to take decisions, due to which quality suffers.

Suggestion: Keeping the same academic eligibility qualifications, the candidate shall be from among the same institutions or from the state.

9. **Ph.D. Increments:** Currently different states have been following different yardsticks to grant PhD incentive increments. Additional increments shall be given only at the time of entry into service to those who have also cleared NET / SLET. Completing Ph.D. shall be made mandatory for promotion into Associate Professors post at all levels of Higher Education institutions.
10. **Retirement Age (Superannuation):** Presently different age level is considered for attaining superannuation. In the same state also there are variations with 60 years for government and affiliated colleges and 62 years for Universities and constituent colleges.
Suggestion: The age of superannuation at the Universities, constituent colleges, govt colleges and aided private colleges and quantum of retirement benefits throughout the country should be the same. Raising the age will be detrimental to the future of lakhs of young post graduate qualified candidates aspiring to enter into teaching in Higher Education Institutions. More over it is unfair to have different types of superannuation age for same kind of faculty in the same state.
11. **Payment of Arrears:** In many states like, Karnataka even after 10 years of 2006 Revised UGC pay scales, the arrears have not been paid completely. It is the lukewarm response from the Finance Departments of the respective state such anomalies continue.
Suggestion: Make it mandatory to pay arrears immediately of its implementation by prescribing last date for getting it reimbursed from the central Govt.
12. **Librarians and Directors of Physical Education** should be treated at par with the teaching faculty with regard to qualifications, promotions and increments. They should be Re-designated as Professors, Associate Professors and Assistant Professors. UGC benefits such as Faculty Development Programmes, Minor and Major research programmes should also be made available to Librarians and DPEs.
13. **Examination Remuneration:** Karnataka is the only state to deny the teachers the remuneration relating to examination work. We accept that examination is very much a part of the duties of a teacher. But it does not mean that teachers should be deprived of examination remuneration. Examination remuneration system should be restored.

We appeal to the Pay Review Committee to consider our view points sincerely while formulating its recommendations. We expect the PRC will submit its report at the earliest. Please ensure that the accepted scales of pay and other terms are accepted and **implemented by all the states uniformly in totality.**

Redefining the Higher Education Mandate – Road Map

Plethora of commission and committees on higher education from Kothari Commission to T. Subramaniam committee made recommendations for making the higher education relevant and contributing to national development. Irrespective of the political parties occupying the Central and State Government sent the recommendations to the cold storage and implemented those schemes as Higher Education Policy (HEP) based on their wisdom and political ideology resulting in the policy paralysis.

Those who are in power suddenly awake and make here and cries, when the international assessment and rating agencies declare the top global Higher Education Institutions (HEI) including universities. The matter will be debated in the mainstream media and in the social media with likes and dislikes and as usual without any follow up action the suggestions and recommendations are pushed to the oblivion.

Making higher education vibrant and fulfilling to the needs of the society requires the basic understanding of the status of the Higher Education Institutions including colleges and universities.

Quantitatively as on now there are more than 300 higher education institutions. Which includes central and state universities, private universities, deemed to be universities and institutes with national repute. In all these institutions and more than a lakh of affiliated / autonomous colleges under private aided and government colleges, the common factor is no permanent lecturers, but are somehow managed by temporary lecturers and guest faculties. In majority of the colleges, there is only incharge Principals and not the designated principal. Still the government is claiming that all is well and India is shining. In some of the states for the last three decades permanent appointment is not made. The management has to bear the cost of manpower and it is directly transferred to the students. The cost of higher education is increasing and has resulted in depriving the meritorious from the marginalized sections to dropout from the higher education.

Looking at quality, the basic precept of quality is fit for the purpose. Those who enter in to the pedestals of Higher Education Institutions, because of the systemic lapses prevailing in the system, come out as unemployable. Lack of infrastructure, Lack of qualified staff, crowded class rooms, higher student teacher ratio and uncertainties in the service conditions of the staff all contribute for the tragic scenario of higher education in India.

Road Map for 13th Plan period:

Deviating from slogans at present we need a coherent policy document which fulfills the needs and aspirations of the students and community at large.

The Proposed Road Map for making higher education dynamic, contemporary and performing for the benefit of primary stake holders requires a budgetary commitment of spending 9 to 10% of the GOP on higher education in five core areas.

- 1. Infrastructure development for upgrading the class rooms and labs:** In the plan period (13th Plan), the government needs to invest on the development of basic infrastructure by constructing new class rooms and upgrading the class rooms with black boards and making the ICT enabled classrooms and basic science labs. This investment to be made in the first phase i.e. within 3 years of the plan period.
- 2. Staff recruitment and service conditions:** Lop sided higher educational policies coupled with political priorities, has declared investment/spending on higher education as non - priority as well as non - performing. It has resulted in huge number of teaching vacancies to be filled by state government and central government. In the 13th Plan period at least the state government and central government must commit to fill the frozen and arising

vacancies on priority basis in every year in the plan period. This will at least assure certainty in imparting contemporary knowledge and relevant skill sets to the students.

3. Curriculum upgradation with skill components:

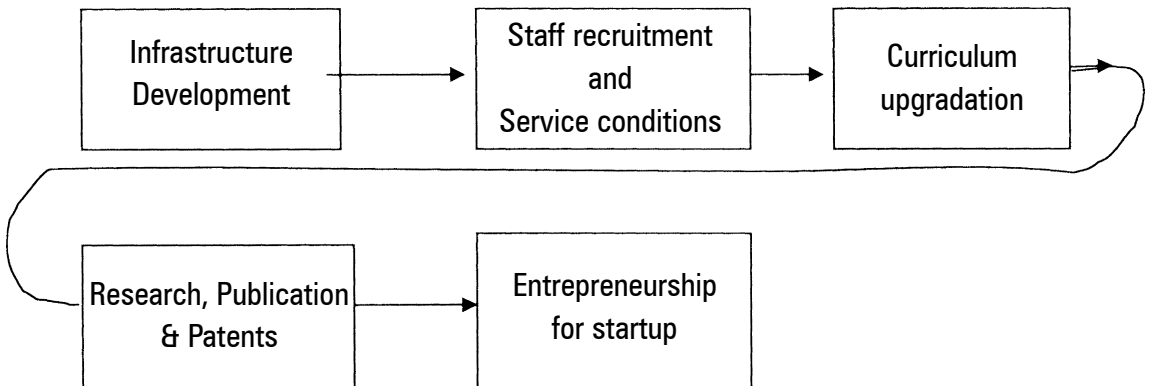
The ultimate quality of students interms of employability or responsible citizenship can be achieved through contemporary syllabus, teaching methods, assessment and evaluations. This task is effectively managed by qualified and competent staff. Due to the lacunae of non filling of vacancies by both central and state government, graduation outcome interms of performability for employment or self employment is severely affected. So there is a greater need to recruit qualified and competent staff and the task of upgradation of syllabus with skill components in a time frame i.e. knowledge inputs at the entry level in graduation course, training in the II year and assessment and certification in the III year. It must be implemented in a continuous manner.

4. Promoting Research & Publication:

H.E.I.s must promote research and publication in research journals of both national and international repute. The twin objectives of HEI.s is to disseminate knowledge and the other is creation of knowledge. Research contributes for increase in the existing knowledge and publication adds quality to the research for further validation. Research also facilities the creation of patents having commercial significance. Research, publications and attempt to create patents is possible only when there is favourable service conditions with low or zero level uncertainties. Funding to research must be ongoing process.

5. Entrepreneurship development and startup:

Considering in a holistic manner in a continuum of higher education institutions, it's the last phase, but not the least phase is startups. Diametrically



Once the government, may be the central or the state, decides the expenditure on higher education as on investment, logically it has to end up in entrepreneurship development in the form of startups or responsible citizens as employers both in private sector and in public sector.

Thus the tasks and responsibilities of higher education institutions are enormous. It requires the support of both central and state governments. In the present scenario of shrinking funding by both central and state governments pushed the higher education in to a dismal position and is jeopardized by myopic policy interventions. If it is our dream for creating institutions of International repute, what we have to do is to follow the advice of Swami Vivekananda. Swami Vivekananda once said "To realize your dreams – Awake, Arise and stop not till the goal is reached".

Pitiable Condition of the Private First Grade Colleges

Thirty years is the time taken for the rise and fall of Private First Grade Colleges. Post Independence, the private colleges were built by individuals, trusts, churches, temples and Mathas in rural, semi rural and urban areas of Karnataka. These Private First Grade Colleges made higher education accessible to the masses with good infrastructure, teaching and discipline. Until recently, the Govt. Colleges did not have these plus points. The Govt. on its part extended Grant in Aide to these colleges. The managements initially chose the best of teachers through Panel selection. NAAC has accredited many of these colleges with an A Grade.

Turn the time machine to the present. There are no students for most of the streams in these colleges. The Arts classes are literally empty. The class rooms that can seat 100+ students hardly have 20 +. This year some of the prestigious colleges across the State have received 3 or 4 applications for B.A., B.S.W and B.C.A. The number for the Commerce stream too is falling in the private colleges. The teacher profile of these colleges has changed over the years. The permanent vacancies have not been filled up. The Managements have appointed local candidates on temporary basis on paltry salary. The Government Colleges today have more number of students than they can accommodate. There are innumerable reasons for this rush in the Govt colleges-

- There are less students aspiring to join general education in general and humanities stream in particular.
- Most of the P.U. colleges offer only Science and Commerce.
- The syllabus and teaching methodology in govt as well as private colleges is the same.
- There are more number of permanent and qualified teachers in Govt. Colleges- permanent teachers from private colleges have been redeployed to the govt. colleges.
- Govt. Colleges give incentives like lap tops, free education for girls and better combinations.
- The fee structure of the Govt. Colleges is very low.
- The infrastructure of Govt. Colleges is improving by the day.

- Govt. is permitting additional sections in Commerce stream in the Govt. Colleges.
- There is private philanthropic partnership in Govt. Colleges which has induced vibrancy and excitement.
- In comparison to the Govt. Colleges, the Private aided and unaided colleges look dated.

If the present trend continues, these private colleges have to face empty class rooms. Many teachers may lose their jobs. The huge infrastructure built will have to be redeployed for other purposes. Its time we asked - should we write the obituary of private aided/ unaided First Grade colleges without remorse? Are there ways in which we could halt the collapse of these institutions?

First and foremost, Govt of Karnataka should sit with the stake holders to stop the downward slide of these institutions which enjoy Grant in Aide. The Department has to appoint permanent teachers or the Govt. should pay the Guest lecturers who work in these colleges too. The Govt. should chalk out a plan to admit 50% of the students under Govt. quota and allow the Managements to fill up the rest of the seats. There is huge infrastructure which needs to be tapped and not allowed to be wasted.

Teachers Associations have a role to play too. Without sufficient number of students, there is a possibility of layoffs. Proper counselling of the young teachers is essential at this juncture. They need to be encouraged to take higher studies or get a degree in education so that they can seek opportunities in the 1000+ Junior colleges that are mushrooming in the state.

The Universities to which these colleges are affiliated have to help these institutions to survive. The Universities and the colleges share a symbiotic relationship. The affiliation fee structure could be tweaked to ease the burden on the managements. The syllabus for the Arts stream needs a fresh approach.

The Managements on their part need to make structural adjustments. They need to redefine general education. The problems these colleges are facing are as much the making of the Govt. which did not put enough checks and balances in place to monitor the Private colleges. In a hurry to keep pace with the market economy, most sectors have abandoned their traditional values. Education is no exception to it. Redefining higher education, the role of values in society, redefining profit in education in terms of social change are the right steps to save these institutions and the teachers who have spent years on these colleges.

Teaching versus Learning: Some Reflections

Does our teaching result in learning? In our compulsion to rush through the syllabus to complete it leading to end-semester examinations, are our students learning something every day in every class? Teachers must be as concerned about the *way* students learn as *what* they actually learn.

Education today remains a mere transmission of information through a pre-determined syllabus in a rigid classroom atmosphere. The main goal of education appears to be to prepare students for examinations where the emphasis is on rote learning. Acquiring knowledge by self-discovery and learning with understanding is seldom encouraged by teachers. In the process of teaching, we teachers need to understand the different learning strategies and styles which will result in true education and empowerment.

Transmission of information does not empower a student—it merely helps to answer questions, verbally or in writing. Empowerment comes from gathering knowledge, learning skills (which can be applied in real-life situations), developing critical thinking and having a definite vision and mission in life.

Learning vs. Education

Learning is not the same as education. Education describes the results of learning and is often tested by examinations. Education is derived from the Latin *educare*, meaning 'to draw out'. Education is about teachers drawing out students' resources and abilities.

You cannot have a teacher without a learner. In other words, teaching cannot exist as an activity by itself. It makes no sense. The statement, 'I taught the subject but the students did not learn it,' is the educational equivalent of the medical joke 'The operation was a success but the patient died.'

Learning to learn is the most important skill in education, and needs to be taught early in life. The educational system concentrates mostly on what is taught, the curriculum, and omits the learning process. As a consequence, many students have difficulty picking up the information. Besides, even if they do learn it, it has little meaning for them, because it has been taken out of context.

Learning and Recall

Learning occurs in a variety of ways and a combination of ways. The effectiveness of learning through the use of our senses is shown below:

How we Learn

- 1% through taste
- 2% through touch
- 3% through smell
- 11% through hearing
- 83% through sight

Learning is far more effective if the participants use more than one of their five senses. If you tell students about a new type of sandwich filling, they may remember it. If you show them the product, they probably will remember it. If you let them touch, smell and taste it as well, there is no way they will forget about it.

A crucial problem of learning is the problem of memory retention and recall over time. Recall of learned material drops away very quickly with time and to an alarming extent after even 24 hours. The solution to this undesirable situation is repetition of the learning at intervals designed to reinforce the memory and recall powers, linked with other training approaches to support the repetition.

Memory Levels

- 10% of what is read
- 20% of what is heard
- 30% of what is seen
- 50% of what is heard and seen
- 70% of what is said and written
- 90% of what is said as it is done

The percentages quoted relate to the amount of learning that is remembered from different forms of learning approach. The least successful in most cases is reading alone and the most successful, taking action while at the same time describing the action.

Learning Style: The VAK Model

It is essential for teachers to understand and respond to different student's learning strategies. Some students may need to listen to the teachers and then make internal pictures to

understand an idea. Others may need visual representation first. A picture may be worth a thousand words, but a lot depends on who is looking at it. Some students would rather have a thousand words any day. Teaching involves leading the student into the best strategies or ways of using the body and mind to make sense of the information.

The **Visual-Auditory-Kinaesthetic** learning styles model, usually abbreviated to VAK, provides a simple way to explain and understand our own learning style and learning styles of others.

Learning Style	Description
Visual	Seeing and reading
Auditory	Listening and speaking
Kinaesthetic	Touching and doing

Visual learning style involves the use of seen or observed things, including pictures, diagrams, demonstrations, displays, hand-outs, films, flip-chart etc. The visual learner learns better when more visual inputs are incorporated in the class.

Auditory learning style refers to the transfer of information through listening: to the spoken word, of self or others, of sounds and noises. The auditory learners prefer listening and benefit more from group discussions and seminars. In a class, children with auditory learning style are found to be lesser in number when compared to those with visual or kinesthetic learning styles. Ironically, most of the teachers adopt the conventional lecture method suitable for this minority.

Kinaesthetic learning involves physical experience: touching, feeling, holding, doing, and practical hands-on experiences. The Kinesthetic learners excel with hands-on experiences. In such cases, a teacher can make use of real life situations. They prefer the involvement of all senses.

VAK MODEL: Insights & Implications

When you use all these main three (VAK) senses in your classroom teaching, your students' brains will be far more activated. Other insights from the VAK model include:

- All three styles of learning are equally important
- Most people possess a dominant or preferred learning style
- Some people have a mixed and evenly balanced blend of the three styles
- Each student has a preferred way of learning

- Classroom experiences show that students feel more comfortable when the concepts are delivered that suit their learning styles
- The VAK learning styles model enables us to:
 - a) Assess people's preferred learning styles, and more importantly,
 - b) To design learning methods and experiences that match people's preferences
- We need to use all three styles. If not, only a portion of the audience is with us
- Teachers, trainers, speakers and preachers can become effective communicators if they use all the three learning systems in their presentations

Student's representational system must match with the teaching methodology. For example, to teach visual learners, you may want to write words on the board, and draw more diagrams, pictures etc. To teach an auditory learner, you may choose more discussions and use music. Kinesthetic learners like to move around, and they will appreciate the use of activities like role plays and simulation games.

Teaching methodology should be selected taking into account all categories of students. A smart teacher includes visual, auditory and kinesthetic teaching aids in his/her teaching method.

It needs to be mentioned that it may not be practical for the teacher to incorporate a number of activities in the same class. What is desirable is a multi-sensory approach to classroom teaching. The Chinese proverb, attributed to Confucius, aptly sums up the strategy: 'I hear and I forget, I see and I remember, I do and I understand.' An appropriate rephrasing would be 'I understand best when I hear, see, and do.'

NOTIFICATION

The UGC in consultation with the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) hereby constitutes the Pay Review Committee for pay revision of academic staff of Universities and Colleges with the following Terms of Reference (ToRs):

- (i) To review the implementation of the previous decision of the Government/UGC under the scheme of Revision of Pay Scales approved for University and College Teachers, Librarians, Physical Education Personnel and other academic staff in Universities and Colleges, and in the process, to evaluate the extent to which the earlier recommendations in relation to qualifications, service conditions and pay-scales etc. have been implemented.
- (ii) To examine the present structure of emoluments and conditions of service of University and College Teachers, Librarians, Physical Education Personnel and other academic staff in Universities and Colleges and to suggest revision in the structure, taking into account the minimum qualifications, career advancement opportunities, and total packet of benefits available to them (such as superannuation benefits, medical, housing facilities, etc.).
- (iii) To make recommendations on the ways and means for attracting and retaining talented persons in the teaching profession, as well as for furtherance of research in the University System and also for their career advancement in teaching and equivalent positions in order to improve the quality of higher education.
- (iv) To make recommendations on the ways and means for the furtherance and improvement in the quality of research in the university system as well as ways to encourage engagement with industry for their research requirements.
- (v) To make recommendations on ways and means to improve quality of teaching and encouraging/incentivizing the use of Information Technology in teaching.
- (vi) To look into the cases of anomalies, if any, in the matter of pay structure and/or career advancement opportunities for any categories of academic staff, consequent on revision of pay scales based on the recommendations of the preceding Pay Review Committee and to suggest remedial measures.

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2. The composition of the UGC Pay Review Committee shall be as follows:

4. The Pay Review Committee will recommend the revision of pay of academic staff of Central Universities and Colleges there under and the Institutions Deemed to be Universities whose maintenance expenditure is met by the University Grants Commission.

5. The Pay Review Committee shall initiate necessary studies and analysis with regard to the Terms of Reference and to make its final recommendations in the light of 7th CPC recommendations.

6. The pay/structure of emoluments for the non-academic officers and staff of Central Universities and Colleges there under and the Institutions Deemed to be Universities whose maintenance expenditure is met by UGC and officers & staff working in the UGC are concerned, it will be finalized, separately, in consultation with the Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, in light of the 7th CPC recommendations implemented by the Government of India, and therefore, shall be outside the purview of the PRC.

7. The Pay Review Committee should submit its report to the UGC within six months of its constitution. The Pay Review Committee shall be serviced by the UGC.

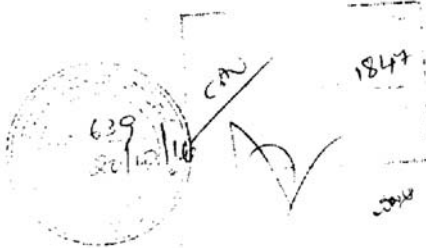

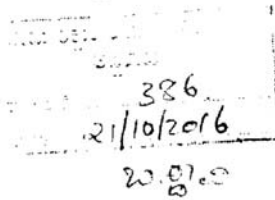



University Grants Commission Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education, 2010 (4th Amendment) notified in the Gazette of India on 11th July, 2016, it has mentioned that the Ph.D. should be in Regular Mode.

UGC has been receiving queries from various stakeholders/universities seeking clarification with regard to definition of the word "Regular Mode". The Commission at its meeting held on 22nd February, 2017 considered the issue and decided that it may be read as under:

"Ph.D. degrees which are pursued either full time or part time will be treated as degrees awarded through Regular Mode provided these are in conformity with the existing Statutes/Byelaws/Ordinances etc. of the degree awarding University. However, the Ph.D. acquired under distance mode is not permitted.
